Non-medical helpers including notetakers, library support, mentors for ASD, ME/CFS, mental health and SpLDs are sourced from University Departments or local organisations with relevant expertise and are, in most cases, employed via Reed Specialist services on behalf of the student. These arrangements have been in place since at least 2005 and no change is anticipated in the foreseeable future although arrangements are informally reviewed annually between academic years.

The University of Oxford uses Reed Specialist Services to supply its support workers. Reed utilises online timesheets; copies will be sent with any invoice along with a student sign off. This sign off may be in electronic format via email where disability related or other reasons mean it is the most practicable administrative solution.
