# It has been a few

weeks since our last walk tour around Wytham woods before the summer. With the new term approaching, we started a new series of walk tours with a lovely trip to Wittenham Clumps. The clumps are a pair of grassy hills along-

side the Thames, which are known for their iconic 'clumps' of Beech trees on the respective hilltops. In addition to providing excellent views of the surrounding area, being an Iron Age fort the hills are also rich with history. We took bus X40 from Oxford to the old Roman town Dorchester, and crossed the river Thames to visit the clumps. After exploring the hilltop and the neighbouring woods, we walked to the village Benson for a break at the Waterfront café, with a stunning view over the river. The weather was particularly nice, with the beautiful sunshine lighting up everything in shades of gold and green. This was a joint walk with the Oxford University Walking Club, and we gathered a good number of people from both societies. The full length of the walk was 17km, while people also got an option to return at 10km after a short break at the café. With fascinating views along the Thames path and over the clumps, there is nothing quite as lovely as exploring a corner of Oxfordshire that most had not visited before. *By* Miaoqing *Yang*

# SECOND NATIONAL POSTDOC MEETING -Shaping Postdoc Culture

Friday the 13th, unlucky for some, but not all of us as we joined over 350 post-docs (the largest staff group within OxRSS) attending (in person or remotely) the Second National Postdoc Meeting - "Shaping Postdoc Culture". How would our experiences at Oxford resonate with other attendees?

A buzz of energy filled the room as we sat down to hear plenary speaker David McAllister, Associate Director of Research & Innovation Talent UK Research and Innovation (UKRI). Did you know there are ~65,000 Post-docs in the UK? David gave a passionate and at times refreshingly frank talk about the many challenges facing Post-docs. With frequent references to the Researcher Development Concordat (more on that in the next issue), David acknowledged the importance to UKRI and the research councils of nurturing the research talent pipeline; that post-docs push the frontiers of knowledge and, while unnamed on most grants, represent more than 60% of funding. He described the responsibilities of funders, institutions, managers and researchers themselves to build a 'supportive and inclusive research culture'.

David's talk was followed by a rich and vibrant

discussion, with Dr Candy Hassall - Welcome Trust, Tinu Cornish – Director Sea Change Consultancy, Samyukta Mukhopadhyay - Civil Service Fast Stream, Dr Emma Williams - EJW Solutions, and David Payne -Chief Careers Editor, Springer Nature all fielding questions. Some key messages: Post-docs are 'professional researchers' – consider yourself as such; you can get co-investigator status on UKRI grants; that post-docs have so much to offer society in terms of skills and expertise.

An afternoon filled with workshops gave us a chance to reflect on career paths and progression both within and outside academia. We'll be taking much from the meeting and hope you'll join us to shape a positive culture for post-docs, and all research staff at Oxford.
