

Mumps in Oxfordshire

Public Health England has seen a recent marked increase in cases of mumps in Oxfordshire. Mumps illness, most recognisable by painful swelling at one side or both sides of the face under the ears, occurs two to three weeks after becoming infected. Other symptoms include headaches, joint pain and a high temperature, developing a few days before the swelling. If you think you have mumps, to prevent further spread, we strongly recommend that you:

- Contact your GP
- Isolate immediately until five days after the onset of the illness
- Practice good hand hygiene (washing with soap and water or hand gel) especially after coughing or sneezing or if your hands may have touched your mouth
- Use disposable tissues if coughing or sneezing

Release of examination results

Once you have finished your examinations, your assessments are marked and your results considered by the Examination Board before your results are processed and released. It is not possible to know exactly how long this will take and for this reason it is not possible to give an exact date when your results will be released. Staff at the Examination Schools cannot give out results over the telephone and cannot advise when results will be available. Once your results are released you will be sent an email informing you that your assessment results and the result for the year (if applicable) will be available to view in Student Self Service. Factors affecting performance outcomes for students who submitted an application before the examination board met will also be available to view from this screen.
