Use of your University Card

The University is aware that some students are loaning their University Card to friends or family members so that they can access the Bodleian Libraries. You are reminded that this contravenes Section 6 of the <u>Bodleian Libraries Rules of Conduct</u>. If a student allows another person to use their Card, they have committed a serious breach of Library regulations and it may result in disciplinary procedures, at a proctorial level, being initiated.

Examination Schools closure in Hilary term vacation

The Examination Schools will be closed from 17:00 on Wednesday 1 April 2015 until 08:30 on Tuesday 7 April 2015. If you are intending to submit work during this period, please be aware that sending your assignment by post, courier or by deposit in the Examination Schools post box means that you will not obtain proof of submission.

Research degree examination submission

If you are submitting your research degree thesis before the end of Hilary term, it should be received at the Examination Schools submission desk by 17:00 on Friday 24 April 2015. Your examiners must have your thesis for at least four weeks before any planned viva. Student funding scam

The University has been made aware of a number of fraudulent cases involving students who have tried to move their funding via money transfer services such as Western Union. Please be aware of potential scams and report anything suspicious to the relevant money transfer service.

New immigration health charge for access to NHS treatment

The immigration health charge is to be introduced for Tier 4 students coming to the UK for six months or more, as well as certain other visa applicants, including student dependants. The health charge, made as part of the visa application process, is expected to affect applications made on or after 6 April 2015 and will be £150 for each year or part year over six months of the visa being applied for, plus £75 for part of a year that is less than six months. The charge must be paid even if you have your own private medical insurance. Nationals of Australia and New Zealand are exempt from the charge. If you already have a visa or make a visa application before the implementation date you will be covered as normal for NHS treatment unless and until you need to make a further visa application. Weston Library public opening weekend

The newly refurbished Weston Library on Broad Street will be opening to the public on Saturday 21 March. To mark the occasion a series of lectures, tours, displays and live music performances will take place. You will also have the opportunity to visit the Weston's flagship exhibition, Marks of Genius: Masterpieces from the Collections of the Bodleian Libraries, which explores how attitudes towards genius are manifested in a number of remarkable books and manuscripts.

Choice of gender title

The titles Mr, Miss, Ms, Mrs are social titles and have no legal status. If you do not wish to use the title assigned to your record, please contact your College Office to have your title amended from this list. You may also choose NULL (no title) or Mx (a gender-neutral title). You do not need to provide any documentary evidence to support your request. You may choose any of these options, regardless of your legal sex or preferred gender.

Reinstatement of graduate research students

The application process for reinstatement of graduate research students has changed. As a result, candidates applying for reinstatement will be asked to provide a work plan and timetable for their return, which should be reviewed and endorsed by their former supervisor. Time limit for the return of research degree examiners' reports

Following changes to the <u>University Policy on Research Degrees</u>, examiners are now required to return the examiners' joint report within one month of the date of the candidates viva or receipt of the corrected thesis. This change is designed to prevent problems for candidates, particularly in cases where the student needs to receive leave to supplicate before being able to take up employment. Transfer and confirmation of status

Sections in the <u>Examination Regulations</u> covering transfer and confirmation of status have been updated to clarify the need for students to ensure that they complete the assessment for transfer/confirmation by the end of the relevant term, rather than just submitting the application by the deadline. The Graduate Supervision System (GSS) is used to review, monitor and comment on student academic progress and assess skills and training needs.
