#### Plagiarism: awareness and avoidance

Academic integrity requires authors to accurately record and acknowledge the source of words, ideas, diagrams, images, research results (all forms of output from others) that they use or refer to in their own work. This course can help you learn about avoiding unintentional plagiarism and how to interpret the Turnitin originality report. You will have the opportunity to put a chapter or article you have written through Turnitin.
