Student Switch Off Award presented by Vice-Chancellor Professor Louise Richardson St Peter's College, Oxford

Carbon Innovation Award presented by Justin Kelly, Business Development Director at Siemens, and Doctor Nick Eyre, Jackson Senior Research Fellow in Energy, and Leader, ECI Energy Programme

The winning project aims to develop a Variable Air Volume (VAV) system that sets the minimum fan speed for the Chemistry Research Building 's eight laboratory exhaust stacks based on local wind conditions. Vice Chancellor's Social Impact Award presented by Vice-Chancellor Professor Louise Richardson

Minerva Lim (Keble College, BA History)

Minerva has played a key role as project coordinator of LinkAges, a student led intergenerational volunteering project that tackles loneliness in older people. She has set up and coordinated two new befriending schemes, which have since paired up approximately 50 students and older people. She has also held the position of International Students' Officer at OUSU (Oxford University Student Union), where she has fostered a stronger international student community by building college networks, raising awareness of issues faced by international students and running more frequent socials.

John Latham (St Catherine's College, MSc Cognitive Behavioural Therapy)

John used his own experiences in developing One-Eighty, an Oxford-based charity providing psychology-focused behaviour support for vulnerable children and young people, pioneering Cognitive Behaviour Therapy within families. The charity now reaches 681 families each year and has extended its success to Buckinghamshire and West London. John has also provided over 1,500 health service users with a voice through his work with Healthwatch Oxfordshire, and continues to play an active role as a volunteer running the Friends of the Young Deaf programme with Oxfordshire Deaf Children's Society.

Philipp von der Wippel (St John's College, BA PPE)

Philip spent his year before university developing ProjectTogether, a volunteer-run coaching service for young people, encouraging them to start new social projects and engage in civil society. The project has supported over 250 young people and has a team of over 100 coaches. In the last few months the project has expanded to Spain and Belgium and Philipp hopes to scale ProjectTogether on a European level.

Makena Lohr (Hertford College, Human Sciences)

As President of Oxford Hub, Makena has championed student social action amongst the wider student body, encouraging students to tackle issues that move them, both now as students and later as future citizens. Besides volunteering for a wide range of environmental groups and campaigns, Makena was a founder of Project SOUP, a micro-funding initiative that uses food waste to raise

money for local projects. The initiative has supported seven projects and brought students and community members together to tackle local issues.
