Leaving Oxford this term?

If you are completing your studies this term there are a few things to take care of before you leave. Remember to collect your Oxford Alumni Card to gain access to a range of discounts throughout Oxford and online. Preparing for your degree ceremony

If you have booked to attend a graduation ceremony in the coming weeks, your college will communicate with you regarding arrival, gowning, catering arrangements and charges. The University of Oxford shop has a presence at graduation ceremonies, located outside the Sheldonian Theatre, selling University and college branded items with a 10% discount for Oxford students.

Visa advice on staying to work in the UK

Visa Advisers will provide information for international students on routes to remain in the UK to work after study, including the provision for students under Tier 2 of the Points Based System. The event will take place from 12:30 -2pm on Tuesday 11 July 2017 at the Careers Service, 56 Banbury Road. There is no need to book a place.

The Counselling Service offers online counselling using Skype if you are not able to access the service in person because you have suspended your studies or are studying or doing research as part of your course away from Oxford. Clinical trials

The Jenner Institute, part of the Nuffield Department of Medicine, is looking for healthy volunteers to take part in a malaria challenge study testing the effectiveness of new malaria vaccines. If you are aged 18-45, are in good health and have never had malaria, you may be eligible to participate.
