## HILL FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP



#### **OVERVIEW**

These awards, funded by the Hill Foundation, are offered to enable Russians of very high academic ability to undertake a period of study at Oxford University before returning to develop their careers in the Russian Federation.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

**Nationality:** You must be a national of and ordinarily resident in the Russian Federation. You must

also have a first degree from a Russian university, and you must not subsequently

have been enrolled in any other degree programme outside of Russia.

**Level of study:** Second BA and Graduate.

Year of Study: New students.
Subject: All subjects.
College: All colleges.

Other Criteria: If you are offered this scholarship, you will be required to confirm that you will return

to Russia for at least one year, following completion of your studies in the UK.

Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of academic merit.

#### **AWARD DETAILS**

**Duration:** Period of fee liability. The continuation of your scholarship each year is subject to an

annual renewal process based upon satisfactory academic progress.

Value: The scholarship will cover 100% of University and college fees and a grant for living

costs (of at least £13,863).

**Number:** 7 to 10 (including Hill awards for graduates).

# VICKY NOON EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

Other Criteria: Applicants must commit to returning to Pakistan after the completion of their studies.

#### **AWARD DETAILS**

**Duration:** Varies.

Value: In recent years these have ranged from partial awards (e.g. £3,000) to fully funded

scholarships (all fees and living costs).

**Number:** 1 or 2 (including awards for graduates).

#### **APPLICATION PROCESS**

You must make an application to the University through UCAS by 15 October 2014 and be successful in gaining a place. You will then need to complete a separate scholarship application form.

Nationality: Applicants must be Australian citizens who are ordinarily resident in Australia and are

applying for a Second BA or graduate degree.

**Level of study:** Second BA and Graduate.

Year of Study: New students.

Subject: All subjects.

College: All colleges.

Other Criteria: Applicants should not have previously studied outside of Australia.

#### **AWARD DETAILS**

**Duration:** Period of fee liability.

Value: The value of the scholarship is AUD\$12,000 p/a, which will contribute towards living

expenses.

**Number:** Up to 6 (including Oxford Australia awards for graduates).

#### **APPLICATION PROCESS**

You must make an application to the University through UCAS by 15 October 2014 and be successful in gaining a place. You will then need to complete a separate scholarship application form.

Other Criteria: Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of financial need, and academic merit will also

be taken into consideration. As this is a partial award, priority will be given to students for whom this scholarship will make the most difference in being able to afford studying at

Oxford.

Other Criteria: This scheme is only suitable for candidates of the highest academic ability who have

outstanding examination results. However, financial need and social commitment are also major criteria for selection. Applicants should be intending to return to their country of ordinary residence following their studies. Priority will be given to students who have

not studied at undergraduate level before.
