If you have a disability requiring examination adjustments, you are also advised to contact the <u>Disability Advisory Service</u>. Adjustments may include, but are not limited to, rest time, extra time, use of a computer, sitting in college and adjustments to seating. Your approved alternative examination arrangements can be checked in Student Self Service.
