



## Course Information Sheet for entry in 2018-19

### Executive Master of Business Administration (EMBA)

#### About the course

The Oxford Executive MBA is a part-time modular programme designed to help senior professionals realise their potential whilst delivering international general management competence to their organisations.

The programme is delivered in 16 one-week modules over a total study period of 20-21 months starting in either January or September of each year. Core modules start on a Monday morning and end on a Friday evening. Elective modules and overseas modules will include weekends.

The programme is made up of:

- eleven core courses, including two overseas courses that offer you a comprehensive understanding of modern business
- six to eight elective courses, selected by you, including two overseas options designed to develop your individual skills and specialisations
- integrative projects, a Global Opportunities and Threats module (GOTO) and a group entrepreneurship project, which draw together and apply themes and topics studied on the programme.

Throughout the programme, there will be a focus on leadership development and you will have access to individual coaching sessions.

Saïd Business School's virtual learning platform and networks enable remote users to retrieve material for core modules and project work, and access the library's electronic resources including programme reading lists and a collection of business intelligence databases.

The assessment regime is a flexible combination of examinations, group and individual assignments. Assessment methods are tailored to most effectively achieve desired learning outcomes. Assessment will take place at the end of each course.

#### Changes to courses

The University will seek to deliver this course in accordance with the description set out above. However, there may be situations in which it is desirable or necessary for the University to make changes in course provision, either before or after registration. ### Additional cost information

There are currently two compulsory overseas modules and two optional overseas electives. In relation to electives, participants cover all costs of travel and accommodation. In the case of compulsory modules, the school pays for accommodation and meals, but students pay their own travel. Please note that this course requires that you are primarily taught in Oxford, and you will need to incur travel and accommodation costs to attend the course if you do not live in the Oxford area.

## Living costs

In addition to your tuition and college fees, you will need to ensure that you have adequate funds to support your living costs for the duration of your course.
