### Industrial action suspended

Industrial action that was due to take place in Trinity term has now been suspended. The University and College Union (UCU) voted to strike in Hilary term as part of a national response

to proposals to change the benefit structure of the USS pension scheme. However, on Friday 13 April, the UCU voted to support the creation of a Joint Expert Panel, and industrial action was immediately suspended.
