

Course Information Sheet for entry in 2017-18

DPhil in Experimental Psychology (4-year ESRC-funded)

About this course

The course is only available to UK/EU applicants. In applying to this course you will be automatically considered for the 1+3 ESRC funding available from the Social Sciences Division Doctoral Training Centre (DTC). Applicants are considered for both the MSc in Psychological Research and the DPhil in Experimental Psychology.

Applicants are strongly advised to visit the Medical Sciences Graduate School website to help them identify the most suitable course and supervisors.

Successful applicants will be offered a place on the MSc in Psychological Research with the DPhil application deferred until the following October whilst their application is nominated for the ESRC 1+3 funding. If the nomination for this funding is unsuccessful then applicants can decide to take up the initial MSc in Psychology offer or, if they can find funding to support a DPhil place, then they can choose to have their DPhil application re-routed to the current admission year.

Changes to courses

The University will seek to deliver each course in accordance with the descriptions set out above. However, there may be situations in which it is desirable or necessary for the University to make changes in course provision, either before or after registration. Expected length of course

4 years

Annual fees for entry in 2017-2018

During the first year of the course you will be charged tuition and college fees at the MSc in Psychological Research fee rate.

In each subsequent year, you will be charged fees at the DPhil in Experimental Psychology fee rate for that year of study. For an indication of costs, the table below shows the annual DPhil tuition and college fees for the 2017-18 academic year.

Tuition and college fees are payable each year for the duration of your fee liability (your fee liability is the length of time for which you are required to pay tuition and college fees). Fees will usually increase annually. Information about how much fees and other costs may increase is set out in the University's Terms and Conditions.

Graduate students who have reached the end of their standard period of fee liability may be required to pay a termly University and/or college continuation charge.

The University continuation charge, per term for entry in 2017/18, is currently £455, please be aware that this will increase annually.

For part-time students, the termly charge will be half of the termly rate payable by full-time students.

If a college continuation charge applies (not applicable to non-matriculated courses) it is likely to be in the region of £100 to £400 per term. Please contact your college for more details.

Additional cost information

There are no compulsory elements of this programme that entail additional costs beyond fees and living costs. However, please note that, depending on your choice of research topic and the research required to complete it, you may incur additional expenses, such as travel expenses, research expenses, and field trips. You will need to meet these additional costs, although you may be able to apply for small grants from your department and/or college to help you cover some of these expenses.

Living costs

In addition to your fees, you will need to ensure that you have adequate funds to support your living costs for the duration of your course.

The likely living costs for 2017-18 are published below. These costs are based on a single, full-time graduate student, with no dependants, living in Oxford. We provide the cost per month so you can multiply up by the number of months you expect to live in Oxford.
