Executive Master of Business Administration (EMBA)

About the course

A part-time modular programme designed to help senior professionals realise their potential whilst delivering international general management competence to their organisations.



The Oxford Executive MBA is delivered in 16 one-week modules over a total study period of 21 months starting in January and September of each year. Modules start on a Monday morning and end on a Friday evening. The programme is made up of:

- nine core modules that offer you a comprehensive understanding of modern business
- six to eight elective modules designed to develop your individual skills and specialisations, selected by you
- integrative modules, including a group entrepreneurship project, which draw together and apply themes and topics studied on the programme
- two core international courses and one elective delivered overseas in key global markets
- individual coaching sessions and a leadership development focus throughout.

Throughout the programme, you will have full access to Saïd Business School's intranet which enables remote users to retrieve valuable material for core modules and project work, and access the library's electronic resources including programme reading lists and a collection of business intelligence databases.

You will be required to attend 16 modules, two of which take place overseas. The assessment regime is a flexible combination of examinations, group and individual assignments, and class participation. Teachers will be encouraged to tailor assessment methods to most effectively achieve the desired learning outcomes. Assessment will be performed at the end of each course. If you fail to achieve the required standard you will have an opportunity to resubmit the assessments.

Changes to courses

The University will seek to deliver each course in accordance with the descriptions set out above. However, there may be situations in which it is desirable or necessary for the University to make changes in course provision, either before or after registration. Additional cost information

There are two compulsory overseas modules in India and China and one (potentially two by 2017-18) overseas electives. In relation to electives, participants cover all costs of travel and accommodation. In the case of compulsory modules, the School pays for accommodation and meals from fees, but students pay their own airfares. This model is typical for this kind of programme.

Living costs

In addition to your fees, you will need to ensure that you have adequate funds to support your living costs for the duration of your course.
