

## Course Information Sheet for entry in 2016-17

### PGDip in Organisational Leadership

#### About the course

This master's-level graduate diploma develops you as a leader who can navigate the complexities of 21st century business. The Diploma in Organisational Leadership is designed for high achievers in significant management roles to question assumptions about management practice and build a deeper understanding of how to manage people and organisations for competitive advantage.

The programme will be offered on a part-time basis and comprises four modules and a business project. Each module will be multi-subject, presenting elements from some or all of the following modules:

- Leadership Fundamentals
- The Strategic Mindset
- Meeting the Organisational Challenge
- The Strategic Leader.

The Diploma in Organisational Leadership offers:

- a graduate-level qualification from the University of Oxford which builds on your existing professional development and experience;
- a deeper understanding of how to manage people and organisations, and of your own approach to the complexities of strategic management;
- focus on the reality of leadership in hard times such as delivering the hard messages while maintaining motivation, and focusing on essentials while watching out for other factors that could affect performance;
- access to top-level teaching from world-leading experts, drawing on Oxford University's strengths in leadership and organisational behaviour; and
- lifelong association with the university through the business school, university networks and college membership - and a pathway to the Oxford Executive MBA.

The Diploma in Organisational Leadership adopts an assessment regime that requires participants to take four courses and satisfy the examiners in the assessment associated with each core course. Students will also submit a project not exceeding 10,000 words, and satisfy the examiners in the assessment associated with the project. Assessment will be a combination of written examinations, and individual assignments.

### **Changes to courses**

The University will seek to deliver each course in accordance with the descriptions set out above. However, there may be situations in which it is desirable or necessary for the University to make changes in course provision, either before or after registration. You will need to meet these additional costs, although you may be able to apply for small grants from your department and/or college to help you cover some of these expenses.
