Um, in addition, um, for graduate students every Wednesday there's either an exchange dinner where we go for one leg in another colleges hall, and then they come to our hall for the other leg, or there's a guest dinner where you get the same food as high table, where the tutors sit, you get that with some wine for your meal. And once a term there's a black tie night which has a four course meal. wine and a prosecco reception. However during COVID times, um, obviously this has shut down and instead has been moved to a temporary bar up in a marquee in the Master's Garden. Here at Christ Church there's also a range of welfare support available to graduate students, so this ranges from your college advisor who will be in your specific field of study and can provide a second opinion on academic matters, and someone else to go for besides your main DPhil or Master's thesis supervisor. And from a more pastoral side there's also Claire who's the welfare coordinator, who's fantastic at what she does, and there's also the GCR welfare reps, and a peer support system, and three wardens who are on call out of hours, in case of any welfare emergencies that happen outside working hours.
