



## ACT ON ACCEPTANCE - WHY OPEN ACCESS MATTERS

Did you know that your open access choices not only affect the visibility of your research but also whether your outputs are eligible for the next REF?

From the 1 April 2016 you will need to act on acceptance to make your outputs REF eligible. Articles and conference papers must be placed in an online repository within 3 months of acceptance for publication.

So while you're celebrating your next article being accepted for publication, make sure you <u>deposit your work</u> in the Oxford Research Archive repository. This free service for University of Oxford Researchers allows you to quickly and easily deposit your work via Symplectic Elements.

#### You deposit, we'll take care of the rest.

## MPs back The Mindful Nation UK report

The Mindful Nation UK report, published 20 October 2015, was the result of a 12-month inquiry by the All Party Parliamentary Group on Mindfulness into how mindfulness training can benefit UK services and institutions.

The Parliamentary work represented the first time that mindfulness has been seriously considered as national public policy. 
