Course Information Sheet for entry in 2021-22: MSc in Global Healthcare Leadership



About the course

The MSc in Global Healthcare Leadership is an intellectually rigorous and highly practical, part-time programme, designed to develop experiences leaders with the skills to deliver affordable, effective and efficient healthcare in complex global systems.

This multi-disciplinary master's degree is led by the Nuffield Department of Primary Care Health Sciences in partnership with Saïd Business School, creating an innovative and integrated programme that harnesses the University's world-leading expertise in healthcare, business and policy.

Global health challenges have highlighted the complexity of decision making in healthcare systems and the need for good leadership to deliver a better future for the health of their communities. This programme will help you develop resilience and the ability to innovate and strengthen healthcare provision.

This programme takes a holistic approach, looking at healthcare from an individual, organisational and systemic perspective, whilst bringing together world-leading departments in healthcare research and delivery with experts in leadership and business.

Designed for experienced healthcare managers and leaders with over five years' relevant professional experience, this part-time programme awards a master's degree from the University of Oxford whilst allowing participants to study alongside full-time employment.

The modular format consists of seven immersive in-person modules taught in Oxford and one online module. All modules will be supported by online distance learning activities and reading. During these courses, you'll benefit from discussion and networking with an international group of world-class faculty, guest experts and peers, whilst receiving privileged access to different parts of the historic Oxford University.

Teaching methods include lectures, practical sessions, small group workshops, one-to-one coaching, virtual learning and real-world case studies, and students are advised that approximately 10 hours of self-directed study per week outside of the modules is required.

The MSc in Global Healthcare Leadership offers you:

- the ability to develop crucial leadership, resilience and innovation skills;
- the in-depth knowledge required to make informed, evidence-based decisions;
- the opportunity to learn how others manage data and lead their healthcare delivery;
- access to top-level teaching and research from world-leading experts including those from the business school and the wider university;
- membership of a unique network of peers and practitioners from around the globe;
- a masters' degree from the University of Oxford which builds on your existing professional development and experience; and
- a lifelong association with the university through the business school, university networks and college membership.

Supervision

The allocation of graduate supervision for this course is the responsibility of the Nuffield Department of Primary Care Health Sciences and the Saïd Business School and it is not always possible to accommodate the preferences of incoming graduate students to work with a particular member of staff. A supervisor may be found outside the Nuffield Department of Primary Care Health Sciences and/or the Saïd Business School. Students will generally meet with their department supervisor once a term.

Assessment

This MSc is formally assessed by eight individual 3,000-word assignments, each worth 10% of the total marks, performed at the end of each module. It concludes with a written dissertation of 10,000 words worth 20%. Students who fail to achieve the required standard have one opportunity to retake/resubmit the assessments. Students are required to pass all of the core courses and the dissertation.

Changes to courses

The University will seek to deliver this course in accordance with the description set out above. However, there may be situations in which it is desirable or necessary for the University to make changes in course provision, either before or after registration. These

Please note that this course requires that you attend in Oxford for teaching, and you may incur additional travel and accommodation expenses for this. Further, as part of your course requirements, you will need to choose a dissertation, a project or a thesis topic. Depending on your choice of topic and the research required to complete it, you may incur additional expenses, such as travel expenses, research expenses, and field trips. You will need to meet these additional costs, although you may be able to apply for small grants from your department and/or college to help you cover some of these expenses

Living costs

In addition to your course fees, you will need to ensure that you have adequate funds to support your living costs for the duration of your course.

If you are studying part-time your living costs may vary depending on your personal circumstances but you must still ensure that you will have sufficient funding to meet these costs for the duration of your course.
